Q: know what makes a friendly trail?

A: A trail with good signs.

Grooming Hints:

- 1)- A good base of 10"-12" is a good depth for grooming
- 2)- Let the snowmobilers run on the snow first before grooming. It allows the snow to de-aerate and compact for easier grooming.
- 3)- Best grooming temperatures are in the 35 deg F - 40 deg F range. Grooming above 40 deg F is not recommended.
- 4)- Best time to groom is when the temperatures are beginning to drop from the 35-40 range to below freezing (32 deg F).
- 5) Recommended speed is approx 5-10 mph. Grooming slower will just roll the snow and faster will blow snow off trail.
- 6)- Try to pull the snow into the center of the trail
- 7)- Watch for riders.

Above are just some of the recommended grooming guidelines and are provided as a help in grooming. They are taken from the newly released Trail Maintenance Program Book just published by the IASA or International Snowmobile Administrators Association. The IASA is comprised of all State Parks Supervisors from across the 27 States that make up the snowbelt.
